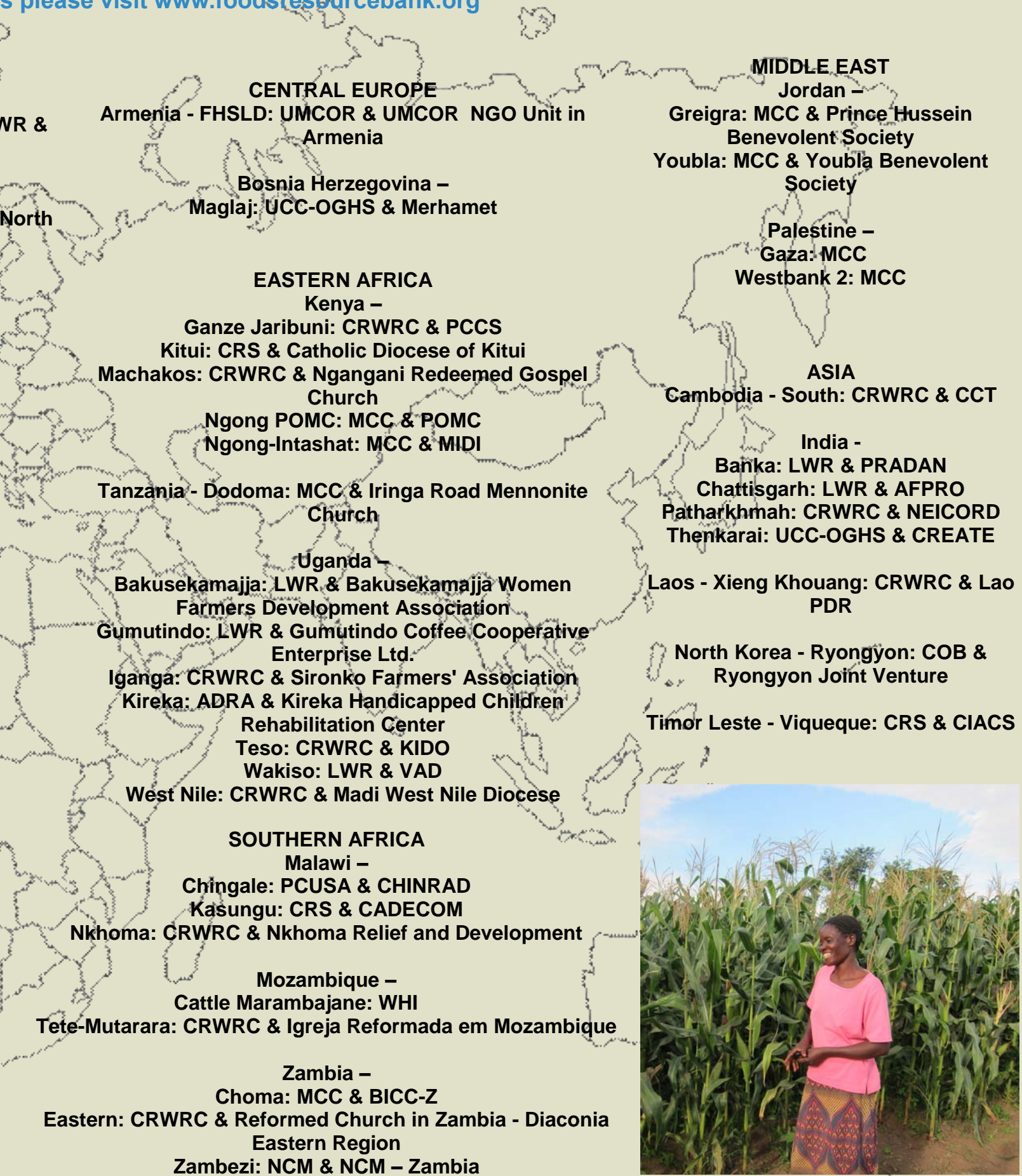

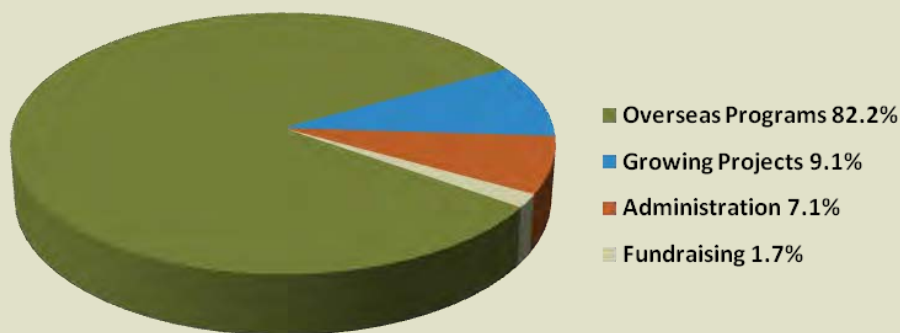

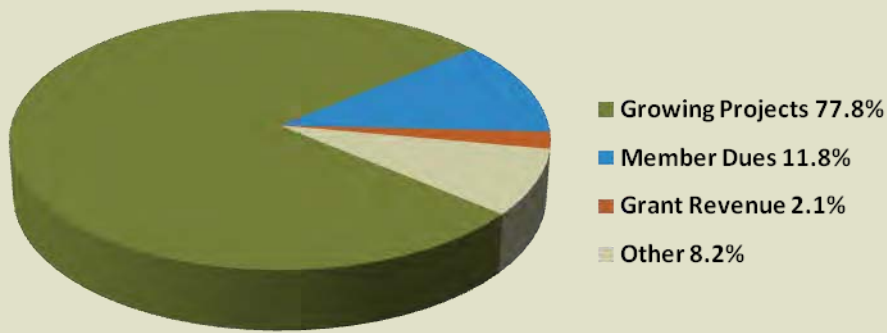
Percent of Expenses (\$3.85 Million)
